Community / Awareness Raising

Monday 1 August

This second 4WD will allow for reliable transport to deliver services to leprosy-affected people living in communities where post-earthquake roads are still practically non-existent.

extend our reach in the country. Prayer is requested as this expansion of our work is considered and whether funding for this will be available.

Please pray for TLM DR Congo's Annual Country Learning meetings taking place this month. Pray for safety of participants as they travel to Kinshasa to meet together. For wisdom and peace for the leadership team as they undertake a new five year strategic phase.

Niger

Thursday 11 August

Dr Mark and Faye Griffiths are returning to Niger and Danja Hospital on 23rd August after Mark having completed the required eight months practice in New Zealand to obtain the renewal of his NZ doctor's license. Pray for journeying mercies and for a good adjustment for Mark and Faye when back in Niger. Continue to pray about the urgent need of another doctor for Danja Hospital.

Friday 12 August

Please pray for the TLM Niger team as they plan programmes with other implementing partners so that they will be able to make positive impact in meeting the strategic objectives set for the country. Pray for grace for Bunmi Oluloto TLM Country Leader for Niger and Chad and his family as they cope with all the challenges this role brings.

NW Zambia

Saturday 13 / Sunday 14 August

We were blessed last month to receive a visit from Dr David and Enless Friend and to view David's presentation on some of the work being carried out at Mukinge Hospital and the Kikonkomene Leprosy Village. David asked that prayer be given for qualified staff to come serve at Mukinge Hospital. They are in need of an anaesthetist, teachers, accountant and specialist tradespeople such as mechanic, builder, plumber and electrician. Families are most welcome.

Bangladesh

Monday 15 August

This week Jasleen Kler (Leprosy Mission NZ's

Programmes Manager) and Tony Wrightson (Programmes Advisor and Programmes Committee Member) are in Dhaka. Pray for safety and protection for Jasleen, Tony and all staff as they travel to various areas to monitor projects and collect data for the mid-term review of Chittagong Sustainable Development Project. Remember in prayer also John Samaddar (Programme Leader) and Richard Mondal (Manager CPDP) and the whole team as they all play an important role in this process. Pray the political situation in Bangladesh will remain peaceful and stable.

Tuesday 16 August

The aftereffects of cyclone Roanu (which happened in May and resulted in homes losing corrugated iron from off their roofs) has indirectly impacted on income for Self Help Group members as the corporate fields are in low lying areas and crops were damaged while under water. Those members depending on fishing have faced many difficulties also. Pray Self Help Group members are able to restore damaged crops and adequately provide for their families.

Wednesday 17 August

TLM Bangladesh programmes include both leprosy control and community-based rehabilitation. Remember today Country Leader Mr Sumon Halder. Pray for God-given wisdom and strong leadership as he leads all the programmes and project activities.

Thursday 18 August

The recent resignation of the Medical coordinator has resulted in new leadership being needed for TLM Bangladesh's DBLM Hospital and the Rural Health Programme. Please pray that God will provide a qualified and committed leader. Also that DBLM Hospital will be able to retain adequate experienced medical staff.

Friday 19 August

Training on ulcer care is being undertaken in two areas to new Ulcer Care Committees at Gandaria and Brahmonbaria. Pray that TLM Bangladesh's Dhaka Community-based Rehabilitation Project will be able to also provide training for the other seven committees for ongoing effective care of ulcer patients.

Saturday 20 / Sunday 21 August

Pray for a successful Annual Country Learning which is being held over two days next week. Pray for safety in travel for all project staff, recipients and stakeholders as they come together to discern the best way forward in ministering to leprosy-affected people in Bangladesh. That further learning will result from this and united efforts will bring new successes on the field.

Papua New Guinea / Bougainville

Monday 22 August

Praise that MFAT (Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade) in New Zealand have approved our funding proposal for the next five years. This project is a joint venture together with The Leprosy Mission Australia and AusAid (the Australian Government's aid programme). Pray that TLM Papua New Guinea staff will enthusiastically work with this new project.

Tuesday 23 August

Numbers of new cases of leprosy being discovered in Papua New Guinea are on the increase. Pray for wisdom for health workers as they raise awareness about leprosy in communities as well as refer persons with suspected leprosy symptoms to health facilities and encourage those who need to adhere to multi-drug treatment.

Wednesday 24 August

Pray the new project concept that will link small scale livelihoods and agriculture to health and leprosy will be successful. Pray for wisdom in this task for project staff. Pray also for unity in the team and appreciation for each other's necessary roles.

Thursday 25 August

Pray that the mid-term review process for the Bougainville Healthy Communities Programme being undertaken this week will run smoothly. Pray for understanding and a oneness in vision as staff, stakeholders and recipients work through processes. Praise that Andrew Harding (Programmes Advisor) for Leprosy Mission NZ is able to be on hand to facilitate the review process.

Friday 26 August

Pray for the team in Bougainville Ruby Mirinka, Programmes Director, and Neil Toura, Operations Director. Praise that as a result of Bougainville Healthy Communities Programme the number of communities with a safe water supply has increased from under 30% to over 90%. Project staff last year conducted 6,798 health awareness activities in villages resulting in improved health practices in rural communities.

Saturday 27 / Sunday 28 August

Pray today for safety for Natalie Smith, TLM Country Leader and the team in Papua New Guinea. PNG is a country which quite often erupts in riots creating turmoil, threats to safety and disruption to project work.

India

Monday 29 August

Pray for the Leprosy Rehabilitation Centre in Chennai set up by Christian Missions Charitable Trust (CMCT) as it seeks to serve the needs of leprosy affected families on the outskirts of that mega city in South India. Pray for continued good health for Colleen Redit, (a New Zealander) who is the founder of CMCT and who has lived and worked in India serving among the poorest of the poor for over 50 years. Leprosy Mission NZ financially supports CMCT.

Tuesday 30 August

Due to an increase in the numbers of people attending the Outpatients Department (OPD) at the TLM Naini Hospital more doctors are needed; pray for the health of doctors presently working there and that the hospital will be successful in employing more dedicated doctors. Remember Dr Premal Das, Superintendent of TLM Naini Hospital. Pray also for strength for leprosy-affected people who have to travel long distances in intense heat to receive treatment at the OPD.

Wednesday 31 August

TLM staff have a commitment to holistically address the needs of people affected by leprosy, and not just their health needs. Pray that staff are able to address health needs of each individual and also their personal, social, economic and spiritual needs.
