Saturday 1 December / Sunday 2 December International day of Persons with Disabilities - Pray for all those persons affected by leprosy who suffer some form of disability and who have faced discrimination. Give thanks that through LMNZ projects, these people are being encouraged and empowered with the skills and training they need to integrate back fully into their communities.

Papua New Guinea/ Bougainville

Monday 3 December

This week Martin Malkaney, LMNZ Finance Manager, and Jasleen Kler, Programmes Manager, will be spending time with the team in PNG at the Reflections and Annual Country Learning held from 3rd to 5th December. Pray for safe travel for all those attending the meeting and a fruitful time of discussion.

Tuesday 4 December

Pray for the staff and stakeholders orientation workshop for the new phase of the Bougainville Healthy Communities Programme (2019-2023). Praise God for the programme's success which improves awareness and hygiene practices as part

of a community based primary health programme which now covers 95% of the population of Bougainville.

Wednesday 5 December

Pray today for a successful meeting with MFAT, the Bougainville Department of Health and LMNZ. Pray that the next phase of the BHCP project will flourish. Give thanks for the radical improvement in health in rural communities in Bougainville who are seeing reduced numbers of leprosy and malaria cases; and increasing numbers of communities with access to safe water supplies.

Thursday 6 December

Pray for the Sustainable Livelihoods Project in Papua New Guinea from 2017 to 2022. Pray for the success of this project as it seeks to provide people affected by leprosy with sustainable livelihoods through income generating activities and training.

Friday 7 December

Praise God for the trained village leaders and health volunteers in Papua New Guinea and Bougainville who are recognising cases of leprosy in their community and referring them for treatment. Give thanks that these communities are being educated on disease prevention, health practices and their rights to healthcare.

Saturday 8 December / Sunday 9 December

Praise God for the Leprosy Mission staff working in Papua New Guinea and Bougainville. Pray for safety and security as these countries are often threatened by political and economic instability and the teams make long journeys through treacherous terrain to reach rural communities. Give thanks for the lives that are being transformed in the furthest corners of these countries.

Really Good Gifts

Monday 10 December

Praise God for New Zealand supporters who so generously support leprosy-affected people every year through Really Good Gifts. Pray that through the sharing of these gifts, new supporters are inspired to partner with the Mission in transforming the lives of people affected by leprosy.

Tuesday 11 December

The Really Good Gift of a **sewing kit** can transform the life of someone living in poverty and affected by leprosy. Lakhi's hands have been severely affected by leprosy. She was given a sewing kit and training and now makes beautiful embroidery to sell in her community. Praise God that Lakhi now has the confidence to use her talents.

Wednesday 12 December

If left untreated, leprosy can damage nerve endings meaning many leprosy-affected people suffer further injuries and disabilities. Praise God that Pavi, a person affected by leprosy in India, was able to receive the Really Good Gift of a pair of **protective sandals** with soft padding, which enable her to get out and about and protect her feet from further damage.

Thursday 13 December

Give thanks for the Really Good Gift of a **sewing machine** that was given to Maya, a leprosy-affected person in Nepal. This sewing machine is adapted to her needs. Praise God that Maya now has the opportunity to provide for herself and her daughter through making and selling clothes and that Maya's daughter will be able to continue her education.

Friday 14 December

Praise God that Anjali, a person affected by leprosy in India was able to access the cure for leprosy through Really Good Gifts. She completed her full course of multi-drug therapy and is now cured of leprosy. Anjali is now back to school. She enjoys learning and her favourite subjects are science and maths. Pray for God's wisdom and guidance in Anjali's studies so she can flourish at school and improve her future prospects.

Saturday 15 December / Sunday 16 December

Leprosy threatens the most basic ability of someone to earn a living using their hands or feet. Give thanks that the Really Good Gift of **vocational training** is training people affected by leprosy in trades where their disabilities do not matter. Pray that more people affected by leprosy will have access to this training and grow in confidence and independence.

Monday 17 December

Give thanks for the faithful support of churches around New Zealand, many of whom have supported our work for decades and collectively, have transformed the lives of thousands of people affected by leprosy. Pray that doors will be opened for LMNZ to reach out to new churches and they will be moved to support the work of The Leprosy Mission in defeating leprosy and transforming lives.

Tuesday 18 December

Praise God for our dedicated and committed Board and committee members who have worked so diligently over the year. Pray for rest and refreshment for them and their families as they enter the Christmas period and for God's guiding hand over the decisions they will make next year. Pray that a movement will be started to repeal the other 119 laws in India that have discriminatory provisions against persons affected by leprosy.

Pray for God's peace and comfort for all those who will receive the devastating diagnosis today. Pray also they will complete their full course of multi-drug therapy and receive all the care and support they need to be completely cured.

Merry Christmas! We rejoice today for the precious gift of Jesus Christ, born to us this day. Praise God for the hope we have in His birth. Pray for the good news of Christ's birth to be spread around New Zealand and across the world.

Give thanks for the 27 member countries who are part of the Leprosy Mission Global Fellowship working to support people affected by leprosy around the world. Give thanks for the 2035 goal of zero transmission of leprosy which the Global Fellowship is working towards.
