#### **Protective Footwear**

#### **Tuesday 1 December**

Protective footwear is a practical way for many new supporters to relate to the effects of leprosy. Give thanks for the open hearts of New Zealanders who learn about this need through letters and leaflets distributed in magazines and who give generously to help people affected by leprosy.

#### Wednesday 2 December

Receiving a leprosy diagnosis can be a very difficult experience, particularly given the stigma that surrounds the disease. Many people face rejection by their families and communities and they begin to fear for their futures. Give thanks for the counselling that helps them to see that they have nothing to fear. Please pray for peace for newly-diagnosed patients and their families.

## **Thursday 3 December**

Give thanks that part of the care that Kanti received during her treatment for leprosy was a pair of protective sandals. These have protected her feet from further injury and allowed the serious ulcer on her foot to heal. Give thanks that Kanti is now able to go back to school.

#### Friday 4 December

Give thanks to God for the creative idea and inexpensive production of protective sandals, which are made in the country in which they are used. Pray for the continuous supply of appropriate materials for the sandals and give thanks for the employment of those making the sandals, which are such a help to people affected by leprosy.

#### Saturday 5 December / Sunday 6 December

Pray that the provision of protective sandals will not only provide comfort, but also give dignity and a sense of purpose for those affected by leprosy. Pray that people will begin to see hope for the future as they are healed with medication and cared for with the provision of these aids.

#### **Really Good Gifts**

#### Monday 7 December

Give and it will be given to you.

Give thanks that the Really Good Gifts appeal for 2020 has touched the hearts of many people, who are willing to give so that someone affected by leprosy can receive a gift that will enable them to have a better life. Pray that God will bless the givers as well as the recipients.

#### **Tuesday 8 December**

Pray that during the final two weeks before Christmas many more people in New Zealand will decide to bless someone affected by leprosy by giving a Really Good Gift that can make a positive impact in the life of a person affected by leprosy.

# Wednesday 9 December

A residential scholarship for a young person affected by leprosy to attend a Vocational Training Centre is a huge blessing to that person. Please pray that more young people will be able to receive these scholarships and have a chance to learn a trade.

#### Thursday 10 December

A vegetable seed hamper, a fish farm and a tradesman's toolkit are examples of popular Really Good Gifts that can give someone affected by leprosy the chance of a new start. Please pray that those who receive these gifts will understand how their lives can change through the use of the gifts and will be able to use them well to make a contribution to their families and their communities.

# Friday 11 December

The Really Good Gift of the Cure enables a person affected by leprosy to access a month of medicine to be cured from this dreadful disease. Pray that through the Leprosy Mission projects, we are able to reach more people affected by leprosy; more patients can receive and complete their leprosy treatment. It is vital, if leprosy treatment with multi-drug therapy is started early enough, long-term disability can be completely avoided.

#### Saturday 12 December / Sunday 13 December

The 18<sup>th</sup> of December is the deadline for Really Good Gift orders so that they can be processed before Christmas. Thank God for the many orders and donations that have come in and pray that the gifts will provide hope and practical help for people affected by leprosy and Covid-19.

#### Nepal

#### Monday 14 December

The isolation ward for Covid-19 patients at Anandaban Hospital is now in use as cases of the virus continue to climb in Nepal. Please pray for patients and staff at the hospital as quite a lot of staff have also become infected.

Without Anandaban Hospital, there would be very little support or essential surgery available to leprosy-affected patients. Give thanks for the continuous care that Anandaban provides and the ability to mend people in all ways – physically, psychologically and spiritually.

Thank Him that the staff provide a safe and caring relationship with the patients every step of the way. As getting to the hospital can be difficult for some people, Patan Clinic is an important Outpatients Clinic which provides education and awareness about leprosy and its treatment. Give thanks for this weekly clinic, which also provides diagnosis and treatment.

# Friday 18 December

Give thanks for the staff and volunteer health workers who travel to rural areas of Kathmandu to meet with and support members of self-help groups. Please pray for safety for these staff and volunteers as they travel and carry out their work.

# Saturday 19 December / Sunday 20 December

Give thanks that the 2020 Youth Advocates have been raising funds for a continuous water supply for Anandaban Hospital. Please pray that the Youth Advocates will be able to complete their financial commitment to this project so that the lives of staff and patients at Anandaban Hospital can be easier.
