Indonesia

Saturday 1 June / Sunday 2 June

Indonesia sees the third highest number of new leprosy cases each year. We felt God's calling to reach out to Indonesia and have partnered with Netherlands Leprosy Relief who are already on the ground. Pray that the partnership will go from strength to strength as we come together and work towards the common goal of eliminating leprosy transmission in Indonesia.

Monday 3 June

We are reaching out in faith for the funds for the Indonesia project solely from our supporters. Pray that hearts and minds will be opened to the need in Indonesia. Pray that supporters will come forward to help meet our target of \$100,000 for the Indonesia appeal.

Tuesday 4 June

"For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11 Pray for the families who bring their children to health centres for leprosy diagnosis. They often arrive with multiple medical issues stemming from malnutrition and poor sanitation. Pray for the families that God's plan for their lives will be fulfilled.

Wednesday 5 June

The Indonesian public's knowledge and understanding of leprosy is still low and medical professionals sometimes don't recognise leprosy cases. Dr. Udeng is one of the technical advisors in the Indonesia project. He travels daily across West Java to educate health centres on leprosy diagnosis and active case finding. Pray for God's provision and guidance over Dr. Udeng and the team so we can reach out to those most in need.

Thursday 6 June

The new Indonesia project has an emphasis on finding, curing and reducing the transmission of leprosy. This is done through implementing the approach of "contact tracing" of leprosy patients, and providing one dose of Rifampicin to those who have close contact with leprosy patients. Pray that this brings a breakthrough in reducing the risk of leprosy transmission. Pray also for opportunities to replicate this new initiative in other leprosy-affected countries.

Friday 7 June

In 2018, LMNZ Executive Director Gillian Whitley and Programmes Manager Jasper Oei met with NLR Country Director Monique and Project Manager Astri in Indonesia. Seeing their technical expertise encouraged LMNZ in our shared dedication in defeating leprosy in Indonesia. Pray for the two teams coming together in this partnership and that the collaboration is a success.

Saturday 8 June / Sunday 9 June

LMNZ had its Annual General Meeting on 25th May. We praise God for a well-attended and engaged meeting. We give thanks to members who took time to attend and together we celebrated the successes in 2018.

Successes in 2018

Monday 10 June

Cure; leprosy is an infectious disease associated with poverty. It is curable. In 2018, 1,125 new leprosy cases were diagnosed in New Zealand supported projects, and 1,730 leprosy cases were put on multi-drug therapy treatment to cure leprosy. Last year, Oswald a 5 year old boy living in Bougainville was diagnosed and provided the cure for leprosy by our project in Bougainville. Praise God for the lives that have been cured and healed.

Tuesday 11 June

Care; Disability is not an inevitable consequence of leprosy but people continue to be affected by disability if not treated early. In 2018, 6,005 people were taught self-care for ulcers in projects New Zealanders support; 445 people received reconstructive surgery and ulcer treatment, and 2,505 pairs of protective sandals were distributed. Pray to God that hospitals and projects will continue to provide free comprehensive quality care for leprosy affected patients.

Wednesday 12 June

Restore; In the projects you support, people affected by leprosy are restored back to their communities. Livelihoods training and opportunities through selfhelp groups are used to empower leprosy-affected people. In 2018, the numbers of people affected by leprosy and disability joining self-help groups increased to 3,475 people. Pray even more people will join in 2019.

Thursday 13 June

Hasan is a 9 year old boy in Bangladesh. When he was diagnosed with leprosy, the community turned against his family because they believed leprosy was a curse from God. Through self-help groups, the community was educated about leprosy and there is no longer any stigma. Pray for God's hand of blessing and protection on health workers who educate communities on leprosy and reduce discrimination.

Friday 14 June

2018 was the second year of LMNZ's The Sustainable Livelihoods Development project in PNG. In 2018, 78 Community Facilitators and 40 Community Leaders were selected and received training on basic health, hygiene, leprosy, livelihoods development, community governance and leadership. Praise God for the successes to date. The project now covers 50 communities in PNG. Pray for God's wisdom and fortitude of spirit for these leaders as they serve people affected by leprosy.

Saturday 15 June / Sunday 16 June

The Bougainville Healthy Communities Programme has been supported by New Zealanders for many years. In 2018, the New Zealand government committed to a bilateral funding agreement with the programme in recognition of the vital role it has played in the health, governance and its social impact in communities. It currently reaches 95% of the population. Praise God for the significant progress that has been made and the funding that will see its continued sustainability.

It is National Volunteer Week (16th to 22rd June). This year's theme is *"Whiria te tangata – weaving the people together"* Volunteering brings people and communities together. LMNZ is very thankful for all our valuable volunteers from all walks of life who volunteer their time and energy to the mission. We praise God for their time, devotion and compassion.

Friday 28 June

In 2018, 108,820 people came together to pray for leprosy-affected people in our 200 projects across the world. Praise God for our prayer partners who uphold the work. In our projects leprosy-affected people feel heartened to know that people love and care for them and are praying for them.

The Global fellowship work relies on its supporters who give faithfully and sacrificially as well as its diligent staff members from all countries.
