Research

Wednesday 1 November

There are many unanswered questions in the field of leprosy, from the mechanism of transmission, to the reasons why some people get severe nerve damage despite good treatment, to the best ways to reduce the stigma of leprosy in a community. Please pray for adequate funding and skilled staff so that more research can be accomplished.

Thursday 2 November

Research helps the Leprosy Mission to ensure both medical and social areas of our work are well-informed and effective. Praise God for the success of the leprosy research programme at Nilphamari in Bangladesh. It has provided evidence for the use of rifampicin (one of the ingredients of the multi-drug therapy) to cure and prevent leprosy from spreading

Friday 3 November

Dr Deanna Hagge is the microbiologist based at the Research Centre at the Leprosy Mission Anandaban Hospital in Nepal. Deanna has presented research papers focusing on both clinical research and psychological wellbeing. Praise for Deana's expertise and commitment. Pray for strength and wisdom for this challenging but worthwhile work.

Saturday 4 November / Sunday 5 November

Stephen Levi is the Superintendent of The Leprosy Mission's hospital in Delhi, India. He drew attention to the impact of transforming an exclusive leprosy hospital into a leprosy-focused general hospital. Praise God for the initiatives that break down barriers and facilitate integration for people affected by leprosy.

Monday 6 November

Last month we sent our exciting Really Good Gifts catalogue to our supporters. Tuesday 7 November

In India, 12 year old Nasrat's life has been devastated by leprosy. To cure her leprosy, Nasrat needs to stay in a hospital which is 9 hours away from her family. Nasrat's family love her dearly, but they simply cannot afford to visit her. Pray that by receiving a Really Good Gift from supporters of LMNZ, Nasrat can feel loved and cared for even though she is far away from her family.

Wednesday 8 November

Nasrat's leprosy is very advanced for someone so young. She has patches on her face, clawing of her hands, and a severe case of dropfoot which needs constant care to prevent ulcers. Without vital medication, Nasrat's hands will claw more, Unprotected, her dropfoot will cause deep and penetrating ulcers on her feet. Pray that Nasrat completes her full course of multi-drug therapy and is cured of leprosy.

Thursday 9 November

Pray today for Nasrat that she will diligently do physiotherapy every day to ease her hand movements. Pray she will receive a Really Good Gift of reconstructive hand surgery so that her hands will no longer be clawed and they can perform everyday tasks like cooking and writing again- simple things we take for granted.

Friday 10 November

Living in poverty Nasrat has never been to school and she has only just learnt to write her own name while at hospital. Pray for God's grace for Nasrat and children like her to be provided everything they need for school including tuition fees, uniform, books and pens.

Saturday 11 November / Sunday 12 November

to bring love and joy to the world, so to Really Good
Gifts will bring love and joy to children like Nasrat.
Pray these gifts will bring real change and
transform the lives of those that receive them.

Bangladesh

Monday 13 November

Please continue praying for flood-affected people and communities. In Bangladesh, 145 people have died and more than 100,000 houses are estimated to be ruined. Pray for God's protection upon them during this tough period of time, that they will be able to recover, rebuild and the Lord will restore their lives and minds.

Tuesday 14 November

Tony Wrightson, Programme Consultant, is in Bangladesh at the moment for a support visit of LMNZ's projects. Praise God for Tony's expertise and for his heart in serving people affected by leprosy. Please pray for his health and safety while he is overseas.

Wednesday 15 November

Give thanks for the positive outcome of LMNZ's Chittagong Hill Tracts Leprosy and Economic

Development Project in Bangladesh. This project has significantly reduced the leprosy prevalence rate in target communities. Pray for God's guidance as LMNZ is working with TLM Bangladesh and community participants in implementing a new dimension of sustainability in the project.

Thursday 16 November

Pray for the self-help groups in Chittagong, Bangladesh. Self-help groups have provided support and skills training to more than 3,000 people living with leprosy and disability. Pray for God's guidance and wisdom as people step up to lead their own self-help groups and that these groups can bring lasting change to leprosy-affected communities.

Friday 17 November

Praise God for the positive impact LMNZ's Chittagong People-led Development Project has brought to the community in Bangladesh. The project delivers a range of income generation activity training such as: farming, weaving, business plan development and vocational training. In 2016, 81% of self-help group members reported that their income had increased, enabling them to pay for school fees for their children.

Saturday 18 November / Sunday 19 November

All leprosy MDT (multi-drug therapy) centres in Dhaka city have been transitioned over to the government's Tuberculosis and Leprosy Control Assistants to improve the sustainability of the leprosy programme. Please pray that leprosy services and the new MDT centers continue to run smoothly.

Gillian Whitley, formerly Donor Development Manager LMNZ, took up the role of Executive Director in August last year. Praise God for Gillian's diligence and expertise.
