Nepal

Saturday 1 / Sunday 2 October

Elderly People living with leprosy

Monday 3 October

Thanks and praise for New Zealand supporters who leave a lasting gift in their Will to ensure fullness of life for people affected by leprosy at all stages of their life. Bequest monies significantly support the elderly living in Snehalayas (care homes).

Tuesday 4 October

Pray that Self-Help Group (SHG) membership will continue to welcome elderly leprosy-affected people into their midst. Pray for wisdom for all SHG leaders. Give thanks for the livelihood opportunities and the sense of community provided by these groups to its members.

Wednesday 5 October

Pray for successful eyelid reconstructive surgery that gives a lease of life and independence to peopleaffected by leprosy in their later years. Praise for medical practitioners. Pray also for positive and lasting results from the training given in eye care post-surgery as this will prevent further disability.

Thursday 6 October

Pray for advocacy for older people to access benefits they are entitled to from national and local governments. Pray those suffering injustice and discrimination are empowered to speak up for themselves for their own rights and entitlements.

Friday 7 October

Shelter, medical care, food, clothing and a safe environment are given to elderly leprosy-affected persons in care homes who have no families or caregivers. Pray staff at TLM India and HANDA (China) are successful in being able to unite these elderly persons with their families after decades of having been separated.

Saturday 8 / Sunday 9 October

To help residents of TLM India's Snehalayas from experiencing depression, they are kept occupied doing work suited to their age and disability i.e. gardening, making dressing sets or packing medicines. Please pray for all residents' health and spiritual wellbeing. Pray for enduring friendships and strong mutual support between residents.

Training

Monday 10 October

Final weeks of training for staff, board, volunteers, supporters and youth advocates participating in the Auckland Marathon on 30th October. Pray for wellness and persistence as participants build their fitness and endurance towards their goal. Praise for supporters sponsoring Gillian Whitley (Executive Director LMNZ) who will be tackling the half marathon event raising funds to cure, care for and restore ten people affected by leprosy.

Tuesday 11 October

Pray for continued success for the Bougainville Healthy Communities Project wherein volunteers from villages and communities are trained in general health care. This training takes place over a two week period and gives elementary public health knowledge to Village Health Volunteers allowing them to gain knowledge about life-threatening diseases such as malaria, TB, typhoid, cholera and leprosy. Pray this new found knowledge will transform the health of villagers and communities in Bougainville.

Wednesday 12 October

To give Self-Help Groups (SHG) the skills to run sustainable and self-managing groups training is given to SHG leaders, treasurers and secretaries. Pray this training will give them confidence when conducting meetings, recording financial transactions and in the general management of the group. Multiple training sessions are also given in micro-finance management. Pray all knowledge received will be shared and put into practice.

Thursday 13 October

Pray for the mid-term review taking place presently in Bangladesh for the Chittagong People-Led Development Project. Praise for New Zealander Tony Wrightson (LMNZ Programmes Advisor and Programmes Committee Member) as he leads the process. Pray for safety for all involved and for a good outcome.

Friday 14 October

Pray for strong connections for the Community Mobilisers in Papua New Guinea as they raise awareness about leprosy in communities as well as refer persons with suspected leprosy symptoms to health systems.
