## A Happy Family



Renagi (second from left) first noticed something was wrong when she was 11 years old. Two of her fingers were swollen and painful. After doing nothing about it for around a year, her family took her to Port Moresby General Hospital to have it looked at. There she was diagnosed with leprosy and leprosy reaction because of the swelling and nodules that had appeared on her body. She started taking multidrug therapy to cure her of leprosy, along with prednisolone for the reaction. She stayed in the hospital until the reaction stabilised. Fortunately for her the leprosy went away and she didn't have any severe disabilities.

In the last year, Renagi's husband Emmanuel (far right) was rediagnosed with leprosy (he also had it when he was young), as well as her daughter Vele (far left). They discovered that Renagi had also probably not take the complete doses of medicine when she was young, and because leprosy was still active in their family, they were all started on the medicine again.

Vele was 7 when they found her patches during a community screening exercise for leprosy. Her parents had noticed the patches, but did not know they were leprosy. They have all been taking their medicine regularly, and Vele has not developed any other complications. She is going to school in Grade 1. Leprosy has not stopped her from doing what she wants and she still plays with all the other children in the community.

Renagi only went to primary school. After she got leprosy she stopped going to school and stayed at home to help her family with their garden until she got married to Emmanuel. They had both had leprosy before, so no one was worried about them marrying each other. Now she works in her garden growing yam, tapioca and sweet potato. Because of having had leprosy, she is not as strong and not able to stay in the garden farming as long as others who haven't had leprosy. She gets tired working in the hot sun. Sometimes when she gets home she is too tired to cook, so they go and buy food from someone else who is cooking food for business.

Renagi is happy to be cured of leprosy and glad her husband and daughter also got treatment and are cured. She hopes to be a part of a new TLM Papua New Guinea project which will support Sustainable Livelihoods in the communities.

#### Switzerland

#### **Donor Acquisition**

#### **Trip to India**

#### Nepal

#### **Operational Research** Workshop

The Leprosy Research Initiative is conducting a workshop on operational research in Nepal on the 5th-9th of February. Please pray that TLM Nepal and partner research groups are able to understand the components and methods of writing competitive study proposals and conducting research in leprosy. May there be a number of operational research proposals and opportunities for funding.

#### **Exchange Programme**

The personnel taking part in the FK Norway exchange programme are travelling to their respective host countries on the 10th of February after attending a week long training in Bangkok. This exchange programme, financed by the Norwegian Government, has given TLM Nepal, TLM Myanmar and TLM Bangladesh the opportunity for two way mutual personnel exchange of doctors, nurses and programmes staff for mutual learning in the first year. Please pray for the smooth running of this project, the safety of all exchange personnel and fostering of a learning environment.

#### International Mental Health Conference

The International Mental Health Conference is taking place on the 16th and 17th of February in Nepal bringing together several partners from Nepal including the Government, multilateral and bilateral organisations, health professionals, social workers, the private sector, innovators, academic and research institutions and civil society in the same platform. Please pray that the discourse on mental health will be of benefit to and inclusion of people affected by leprosy. Please pray that our paper and poster presentations be well received and help in culminating partnerships for increased mental health interventions.

#### **Construction Works**

Please continue to pray for the construction work at Anandaban Hospital which has been ongoing since the 2015 earthquakes. May we be able to continue to provide quality services whilst redeveloping Anandaban. Please give strength to all the construction workers, technical advisers led by Engineer Tek Sharma and Article 25 (architecture organisation). May coordination and communication be uninterrupted and efficient.

#### **Annual Reports**

Please pray that all TLM Nepal projects are able to report excellent project achievements for the annual reports. May TLM Nepal Country Office be able to support all projects in submitting the reports on time.

#### Bangladesh

#### Recruitment

The staff now needed at DBLM Hospital includes a Medical Officer, a Program Leader, a Nursing Officer, an Assistive Device Technician and a Pharmacist. Please continue to pray for the recruitment process and the new team members.

#### **Hospital Funding**

DBLM Hospital is suffering from a funding crisis. Pray

that local resources can be properly utilised to face this crisis and may Jesus bless us like he fed more than five thousand people with five loaves of bread and two fish at Bethsaida. The services available at DBLM Hospital are vital for people affected by leprosy in Bangladesh.

#### **Outpatient Department**

We give thanks to the Lord that though DBLM Hospital is suffering from lack of funds, more people are getting services through the new Outpatient Department and the local income of the hospital is therefore increasing as well as being able to serve more people in the community for general diseases.

#### **Association AGM**

28 sub-district associations of self-help groups with all their members will arrange Annual General Meetings in the first quarter of the year in North West Bangladesh. For associations whose committees have completed their leadership term, this will include elections for new committees. Please pray for association leaders to run their associations and selfhelp groups effectively.

#### **Healing for Shohag**

Please pray for Shohag Mondal, a Community Development Facilitator of Dhaka Community Based Rehabilitation Project who had a serious motorcycle accident with a bus in October and at time of writing is still in hospital. He needs God's healing hands upon him for his quick recovery and financial support for his treatment. Please also pray for his family members and his fiancée.

#### 19 - 25 February

#### New Zealand

#### **Daily Work**

Pray for fresh ideas, wisdom and strength for the small team in New Zealand as they carry out their everyday work.

#### **Board Meeting**

Pray for a fruitful Board meeting of The Leprosy Mission New Zealand on 19th May. Pray for oneness in hearts and wisdom in all decision making.

#### England and Wales

#### **Board and Vice Presidents**

Please continue to pray for TLM England and Wales's Board of Trustees and for its Vice Presidents. Give thanks for the Trustees and Vice Presidents' commitment to the vital roles they play. Pray for wisdom and discernment for them and particularly in any decisions they make as they continue to ensure good governance of the charity.

#### **Staff Travelling**

Pray for TLM England and Wales staff travelling to Nepal this week: for their safety and protection. Pray that they can collect stories and information about how leprosy affects the people we serve, which will touch the hearts of donors and inspire them to give generously to the work of the Mission.

#### Customer Relationship Management

Continue to pray for the work of the Customer Relationship Management project team as they work on the detail of implementing the project; showing and testing the component blocks to users and continuing to data cleanse and the change control process.

Give thanks for TLM England and Wales's stamps volunteers, Mandy, Fay, John and Shirley who open donated parcels of stamps, sort and bag them and write thank you cards. Without these volunteers the team would not be able to fulfil the dealers' orders.

#### **Repealing Discrimination**

A Private Members' Bill for repealing discriminatory laws (like the Eliminating **Discrimination against People** Affected by Leprosy Bill [EDPAL] which we have been praying for) is slated to be presented in the Parliament in the Winter Session starting from 15th December 2017. We do not know at time of writing whether it will have been presented. God's intervention is needed for this Bill (Private Members' Bill) or EDPAL Bill to be passed in the Parliament.

#### Lobbying

TLM India's state core teams in various states are lobbying with the respective state governments for implementation of the recommendations in Report 256 of the Law Commission of India. Please pray that the state governments take up the issues seriously.

#### 19 - 25 March

#### Nigeria

#### Fundraising

TLM Nigeria's fundraising team is in the second year of implementing its fundraising plan. We thank God for the new partnerships and relationships and commit the strategic fundraising plan for 2018 to Him. Pray that God will continuously favour and guide the fundraising team to the right prospective corporate sponsors, institutional funders, and individual donors. Ask that God will grant the team wisdom to harness available opportunities, and equip them with innovative ideas for the development of new channels of income and partnership.

#### Leadership Change

We thank God for Dr Moses Onoh who acted as country leader while Dr Sunday Udo was away on leave of absence, and we thank God for a successful handover. Pray to God for wisdom and grace for Dr Sunday as he resumes.

#### **Operating Theatre**

The newly constructed operating theatre for the Leprosy Referral Hospital in Niger State of Nigeria has added a lot of value and improved healthcare provided to persons affected by leprosy. The government has written formally to appreciate TLM Nigeria for the support and pledged to ensure sustainability of the facility; and assurance to address the issues of personnel, and access road. They have repaired the standby generator and now provide funding for fuel to the hospital management. We thank God for improved commitment and visibility to the concerns of people affected by leprosy.
