#### Wednesday 2 October

One of the best ways to find new cases of leprosy is to screen the people who live or work near a newly diagnosed person. In 2023, teams of The Leprosy Mission and their partners have conducted this work most thoroughly in Bangladesh, DR Congo, Sri Lanka, India, and Mozambique. Give thanks that many government health ministries are starting to see the value of contact screening.

## **Thursday 3 October**

The Leprosy Mission are working with partners to explore new, more effective antibiotics for preventing leprosy. Give thanks for the PEP++ research project, working on a combination of antibiotics that will be more effective than a single dose of Rifampicin. Pray that results of the research will be clear so the effectiveness of the antibiotic trial will be evident for the benefit of people affected by leprosy and their families.

#### Friday 4 October

Please pray about the work being done alongside partners to explore the use of a completely new antibiotic, Telacebec. This antibiotic is very promising and could cure leprosy faster and more effectively than anything we have seen before. Give thanks for the research being carried out to improve the treatment for people affected by leprosy.

## Saturday 5 October/ Sunday 6 October

In Sri Lanka churches, mosques, Hindu and Buddhist temples are all engaged in raising the awareness of leprosy. Give thanks for the many different faith leaders involved in the fight to end leprosy

## Bangladesh

During October, training in slit skin smears will be provided for Government TB and Leprosy Control Assistants. This will be done through the Leprosy Control Project at Nilphamari Medical College and Hospital. Give thanks for the facility and the staff to carry out the training. Pray that those trained will go on to greater expertise in the diagnosis of TB and leprosy.

#### **Tuesday 15 October**

Give thanks for the Proyash Project. The project aims to improve the health of people affected by leprosy. They work to improve access to quality healthcare, improve the execution of active case finding and provide awareness campaigns for a better understanding of leprosy. Give thanks for the comprehensive programmes the Proyash Project carries out.

#### Wednesday 16 October

During November a team will carry out an evaluation of the Proyash Project. Please pray for the ability to navigate the evaluation process smoothly and successfully. Also pray that the benefits and challenges of the project will be clearly seen so that good decisions can be made for the future.

#### **Thursday 17 October**

Mohammed Shahajalal and Mohammed Abdur Rahaman are disabled due to leprosy. They have been admitted to DBLM Hospital because of bad ulcers and other difficulties. Please pray for quick recovery, strength and mental wellbeing for these two men and all others in similar situations.

## Friday 18 October

Many people affected by leprosy and their families have recently been impacted by monsoon floods in Brahmonbaria, Feni and Noakhali districts. Please pray for them to be able to overcome the difficult situations they are in and restore normality in their lives.

## Saturday 19 October/ Sunday 20 October

Give thanks that The Leprosy Mission Bangladesh has pioneered an innovative approach to leprosy services. Work is done at a local level by partnering with individuals, community organisations, the media and government healthcare workers. Give thanks that these local partners advocate for leprosy treatment to be provided by local health centres, combat stigma, raise awareness and help identify new leprosy cases.

#### Indonesia

## Monday 21 October

Indonesia should have a new President and administration installed during October. Please pray that the new government will show a strong commitment to addressing neglected diseases, especially leprosy.

## **Tuesday 22 October**

As part of the Leprosy Control Programme the team in Indonesia have carried out training for some people affected by leprosy. Please pray that this will lead to greater participation by people affected by leprosy in efforts to fight the disease. Also pray that the trained people will join leprosy-related organisations, where they can make a valuable contribution.

#### Wednesday 23 October

Please pray about the efforts being undertaken to reduce the stigma of leprosy in communities. The stigma is found at all levels of Indonesian society so advocacy for people affected by leprosy is being undertaken with health organisations and other groups. Please pray that these efforts will raise awareness and lead to a decrease in the stigma of leprosy.

## **Thursday 24 October**

Give thanks that the PEPCOM project in Indonesia supports the work of local health facilities. Give thanks for the relationship between TLM NZ and the local organisation, Yayasan NLR. Staff of the local organisation are carrying out the PEPCOM project with some financial contributions from New Zealand supporters.

## Friday 25 October

Disruptions to routine health services create barriers to patients accessing health facilities and treatment. Please pray that disruptions will be minimised in Indonesia so that people needing treatment can get the medication and services they need to recover.

#### Saturday 26 October/ Sunday 27 October

#### **Papua New Guinea**

#### Monday 28 October

#### **Tuesday 29 October**

The aims of the training programmes for volunteers are to ensure that health knowledge is widely known in communities. Pray that learning, sharing and ownership of knowledge will empower community decision-making, leading to change in behaviour among individuals and families.

## Wednesday 30 October

The referral pathways established ensure that people affected by leprosy, vulnerable and marginalised people feel safe and included in their communities. Give thanks that there is an increasing number of suspected cases of leprosy being found through active case finding. Please pray for continuation of the activities and of change in people's lives.

## Thursday 31 October

Give thanks that local people are gaining the know-how to establish essential water, sanitation, and hygiene infrastructure. This means providing access to taps and toilets. Instead of relying on a few bush latrines or pit latrines for the whole village. Please pray that the goal of having a pit toilet for every household can be realised. This will significantly reduce the risk of contracting disease.
